

Regulations on Graduation Project Research

Article 1 (Purpose)

The purpose of these Regulations is to prescribe detailed matters concerning graduation project research in accordance with the Academic Regulations of Woosong University (hereinafter referred to as the “University”).

Article 2 (Completion of Graduation Project Research)

- ① Students of the University may complete the graduation project research course included in the curriculum during their enrollment. However, depending on the characteristics of the department or major, the course may not be offered or required.
- ② Graduation project research shall, in principle, be completed during regular semesters. However, it may be completed during summer or winter sessions with approval from the President.
- ③ If overlapping with an internship semester or similar program, the graduation project research may be completed through alternative formats such as weekend or evening classes.

Article 3 (Research Plan Submission)

Students shall prepare and submit a graduation project research plan related to their major at the beginning of the semester.

Article 4 (Supervision Plan)

- ① The head of the department shall collect submitted research plans, classify them by specialization, assign academic advisors, and prepare a supervision plan to be submitted to the Academic Affairs Office.
- ② The method of conducting the graduation project research shall be determined by the assigned academic advisor and specified in the supervision plan.

Article 5 (Supervision of Research)

- ① The assigned academic advisor shall be responsible for supervising the entire research process, from planning to execution, combining attendance-based instruction and project-based learning.
- ② If the advisor determines that the submitted research plan is inappropriate, it may be revised. Any changes must be submitted to the department head within four weeks from the beginning of the semester.

Article 6 (Presentation and Evaluation)

- ① Each department shall hold a graduation project research presentation (e.g., presentation, report, exhibition) according to the established plan.
- ② The content and format of the presentation may be determined by the departmental evaluation committee.

Article 7 (Grading)

- ① Grades for graduation project research shall be evaluated in accordance with the evaluation method for pure experimental or practical courses.
- ② Credits earned from graduation project research shall be included in the total graduation credits.

Article 8 (Miscellaneous)

Matters not specified in these Regulations shall be determined by the President following deliberation by the Academic Affairs Committee.
