

## Regulations on Recognition of Other Academic Credits

### Article 1 (Purpose)

The purpose of these Regulations is to prescribe detailed matters concerning the recognition of other academic credits pursuant to:

### Article 2 (Definition and Types)

① “Recognition of Other Academic Credits” refers to the process by which a student completes a separate program or qualification, undergoes evaluation, and receives academic credit. The types of recognition are as follows:

#### 1. Pre-Evaluation System

Refers to the recognition of credits earned through participation in curricular or extracurricular programs prior to admission or during enrollment, before completing the formal curriculum.

#### 2. Self-Directed Learning System

Refers to cases where, due to unavoidable circumstances in curriculum operation, students complete alternative assignments or learning activities approved by the Department-level Evaluation Committee and receive academic credit.

#### 3. Special Evaluation System

Refers to recognition of credits for studies, research, or practical training completed at domestic or international universities, public institutions, research institutes, or industries that have agreements with the University, subject to departmental evaluation.

② Programs under the Pre-Evaluation System may include general education and major-related courses.

③ To receive credit under any of the above systems, the completed learning must be equivalent to **at least 15 hours per credit**, including instruction, experiments, practical training, research, or faculty supervision, as stipulated in Article 28(2).

### Article 7 (Miscellaneous)

Matters not specified in these Regulations shall be governed by relevant regulations and determined by the President.

### Article 8 (Scope and Method of Credit Recognition)

① The total number of credits that may be earned through credit recognition during enrollment shall not exceed 4 credits.

② Credits obtained through recognition may be classified as general education or major credits, taking into account the nature of the completed coursework or qualifications, subject to review at the departmental level.

③ Grades for recognized credits shall be recorded as Pass (P) or Fail (F).

④ In order to obtain credit recognition through the methods specified in Paragraph 2, Subparagraph 1, an application for credit recognition must be submitted in advance, and approval from the President must be obtained following departmental review or evaluation regarding its relevance to the curriculum.

⑤ Notwithstanding Paragraph 1, international students admitted after completing a pre-admission program may be granted up to 9 credits.

⑥ Notwithstanding Paragraph 5, students admitted to the Department of Human Digital Interface may be granted credit recognition of up to one-fourth of the total credits required for graduation through pre-admission or special admission programs.

⑦ Paragraphs 5 and 6 shall not be applied cumulatively
