

Scholarship Regulations

Chapter 1 General Provisions

Article 1 (Purpose)

The purpose of these regulations is to prescribe matters concerning the selection of scholarship recipients and the granting of scholarships in order to promote academic motivation and to discover and foster talented students at Woosong University (hereinafter referred to as “the University”).

Article 2 (Scope of Application)

The selection of scholarship recipients and the awarding of scholarships shall be governed by these regulations, except where otherwise specified by individual scholarship organizations. However, SolBridge International School of Business may establish separate provisions with the approval of the President.

Article 3 (Eligibility for Scholarships)

Students eligible to receive scholarships shall meet one of the following criteria. However, students who have received disciplinary action of probation or higher shall be eligible only after one year has elapsed from the date of release from such action:

1. Students with excellent academic performance and conduct
2. Students who have contributed to the development of the University
3. Direct descendants of national merit recipients or veterans
4. Faculty/staff members of the University, their spouses, and direct descendants
5. Students recommended by faculty members who wish to engage in on-campus work
6. Students with financial difficulties
7. Students recognized by the President for other valid reasons

Chapter 2 Scholarship Committee

Article 4 (Composition of the Scholarship Committee)

① A Scholarship Committee (hereinafter referred to as “the Committee”) shall be established to deliberate on scholarship matters.

② The Committee shall consist of no more than seven members, including:

- Vice President for Administration (Chairperson)
- Vice President for Academic Affairs
- Director of Student Affairs
- Director of General Affairs
- Additional members appointed by the President upon recommendation

Article 5 (Functions)

The Committee shall deliberate on:

1. Selection and awarding of scholarships
2. Allocation of scholarships
3. Other matters assigned by the Chairperson

Article 6 (Meetings)

① Meetings shall be convened by the Chairperson.

② A quorum shall consist of two-thirds of the members, and decisions shall require a majority vote.

③ Approved matters shall be implemented upon approval by the President.

Chapter 3 Types and Awarding of Scholarships

Article 7 (Classification of Scholarships)

Scholarships shall be classified as follows:

1. Internal scholarships
2. External scholarships
3. Graduate scholarships

Article 8 (Types of Internal Scholarships and Eligibility)

1. Academic Excellence Scholarships

- a. Awarded to students with outstanding entrance exam performance (details determined separately).
- b. For enrolled students, eligibility includes:
 - Minimum 15 credits (regular semesters) or 3 credits (summer/winter)
 - GPA of 3.0 or higher
 - No failing grades or withdrawn courses
 - Ranking based on:
 - Academic performance (85%)
 - Service, character, financial status, and Woosong mileage (15%)
- c. Transfer/readmitted students must complete at least one semester before eligibility.
- d. other matters shall be determined by the Scholarship Committee.
- e. Students who take leave after registration may retain benefits; otherwise, benefits are forfeited.
- f. Students who change majors shall lose scholarship benefits for the semester.

2. National Merit, Veteran, and Faculty Scholarships

- National merit recipients: full tuition exemption
- Veterans' family scholarships: tuition exemption for students with at least 70% score
- Faculty/staff scholarships: for employees and their families (minimum 12 credits, except seniors)

3. Work-Study Scholarships

Awarded to students engaged in on-campus work to support their tuition.

4. Special Scholarships

- a. High-achieving students (entrance exam/language) may receive full or partial tuition for up to four years, subject to GPA (minimum 3.75).
- b. Students who pass national-level examinations may receive scholarships.
- c. Students with outstanding achievements in arts, sports, or technical fields (minimum GPA 2.0).
- d. Students employed in industry with significant contributions to society and the University.

5. Overseas Study Scholarships

Awarded to academically excellent students participating in overseas study programs.

6. Other Scholarships

Other scholarships shall be granted according to separate guidelines.

Article 9 (External Scholarships)

External scholarships shall be awarded according to the criteria set by the sponsoring organization or donor.

Article 10 (Graduate Scholarships)

Graduate scholarships shall be awarded in accordance with separate graduate school guidelines.

Chapter 4 General Provisions for Scholarship Administration

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Article 11 (Allocation of Scholarships)

Scholarships shall be allocated proportionally based on department size and number of enrolled students.

Article 12 (Selection Procedures)

Faculty advisors shall recommend eligible students, departments shall rank candidates, and final lists shall be submitted to the Committee.

Article 13 (Final Approval)

The Committee shall finalize scholarship recipients upon deliberation.

Article 14 (Payment of Scholarships)

Scholarships may be awarded either as tuition reduction or cash payment.

Article 15 (Duration)

Scholarships shall apply to one semester unless otherwise specified.

Article 16 (Prohibition of Double Benefits)

Students may not receive multiple scholarships exceeding tuition. External scholarships shall take priority.

Exceptions apply to:

- Living allowances
- Work-based scholarships
- One-time awards

Article 17 (Loss of Eligibility)

Scholarship eligibility shall be revoked if:

1. The student receives disciplinary action
2. False information is submitted
3. The student is excluded during Committee review

Article 18 (Obligations of Scholarship Recipients)

Recipients must demonstrate academic diligence and exemplary conduct.

Article 19 (Minimum Credit Requirement for National Aid Programs)

The minimum credit requirement shall be 9 credits in accordance with relevant regulations.

Article 20 (Supplementary Provisions)

Matters not specified in these regulations shall be determined by the President upon deliberation by the Committee.
